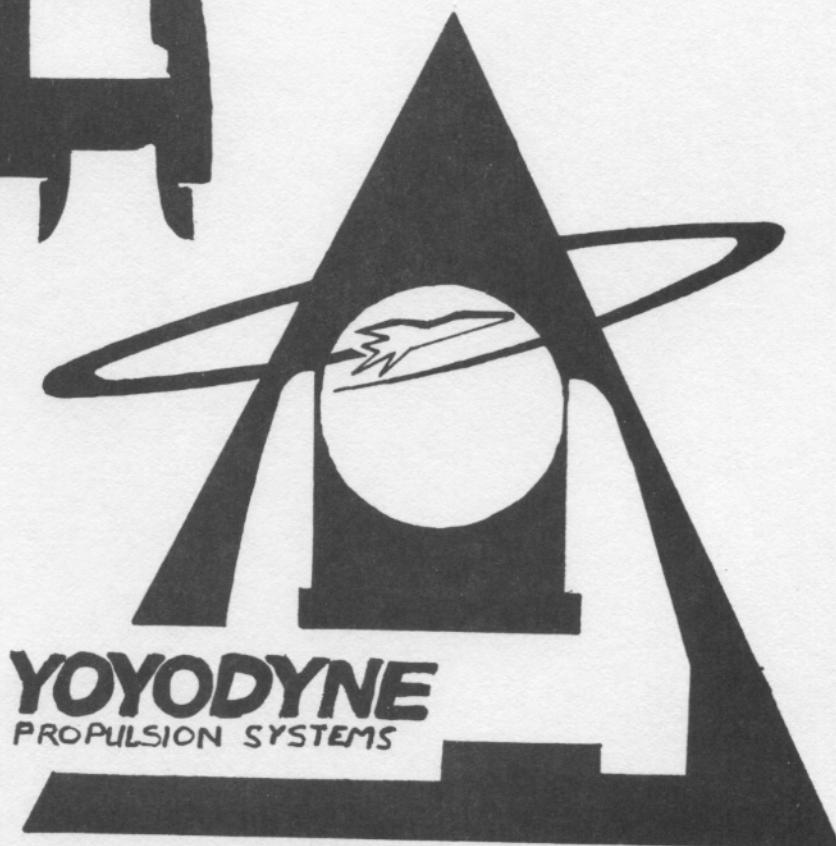
SODA JERK

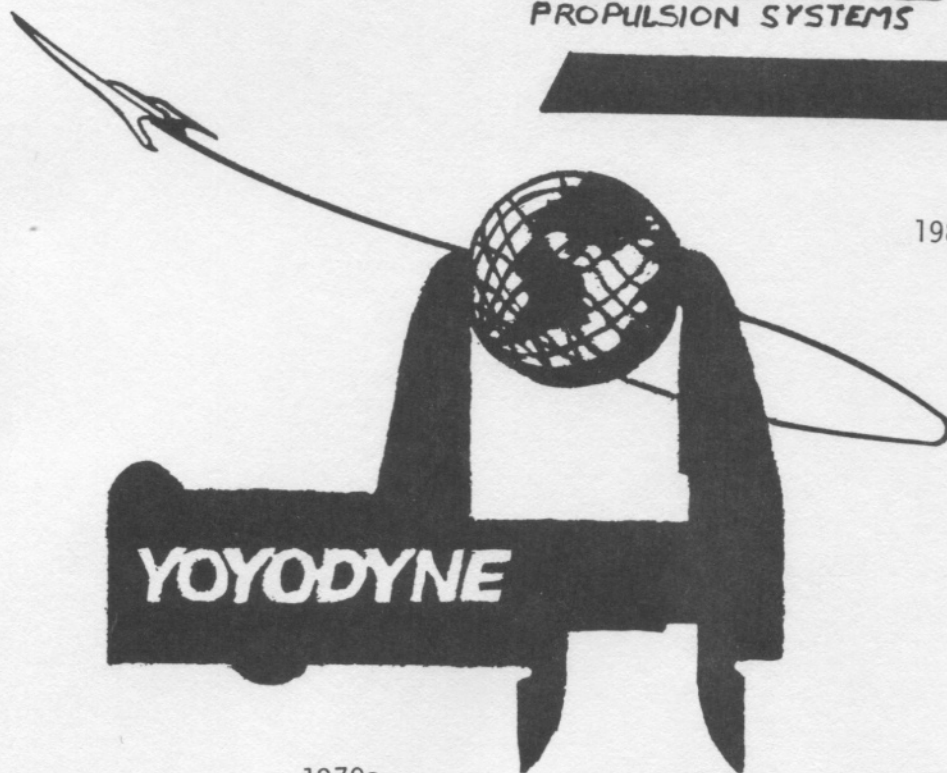

KNIGHT OF THE LESSER SPEEDWAYS

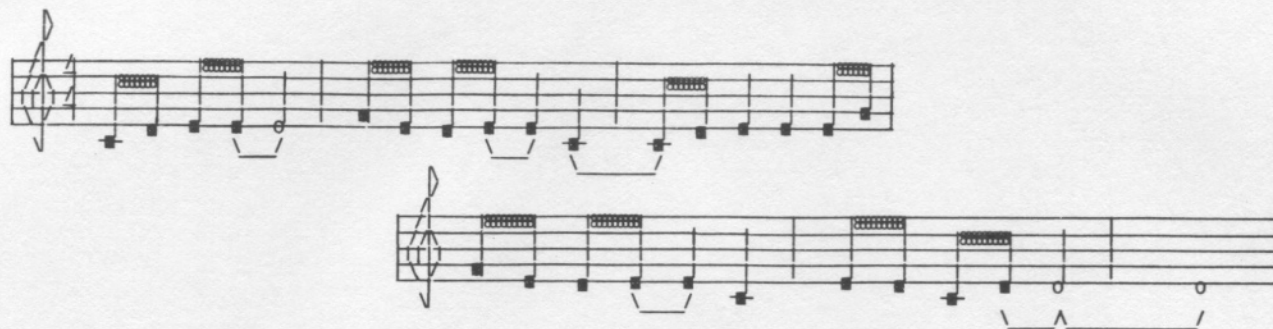
Perfect Tommy and the Jet Car disap-

SOUND AND FURY

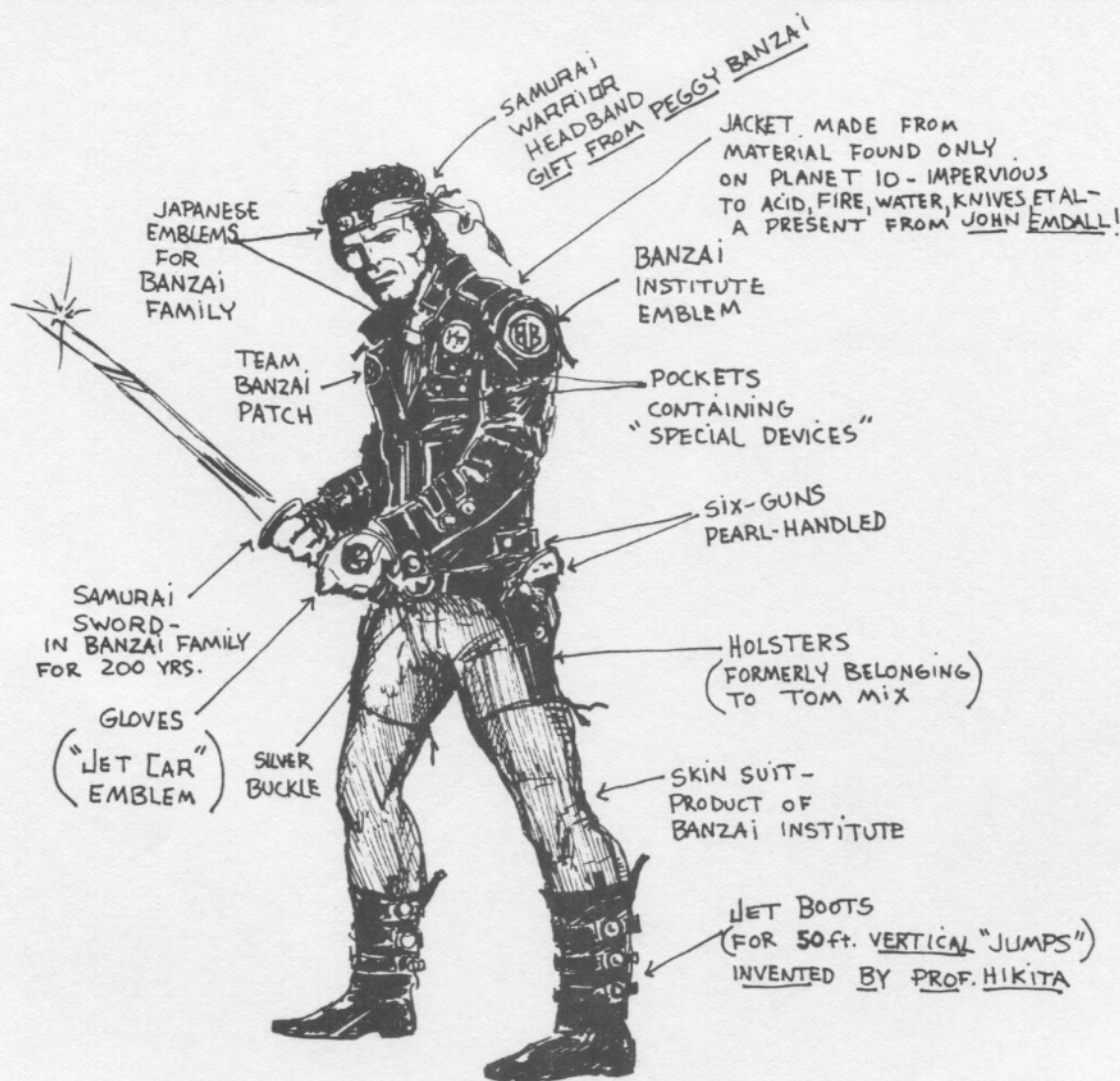
Clyde Von Drake, the Banzai Institute's

"A TREE IS A TREE..."

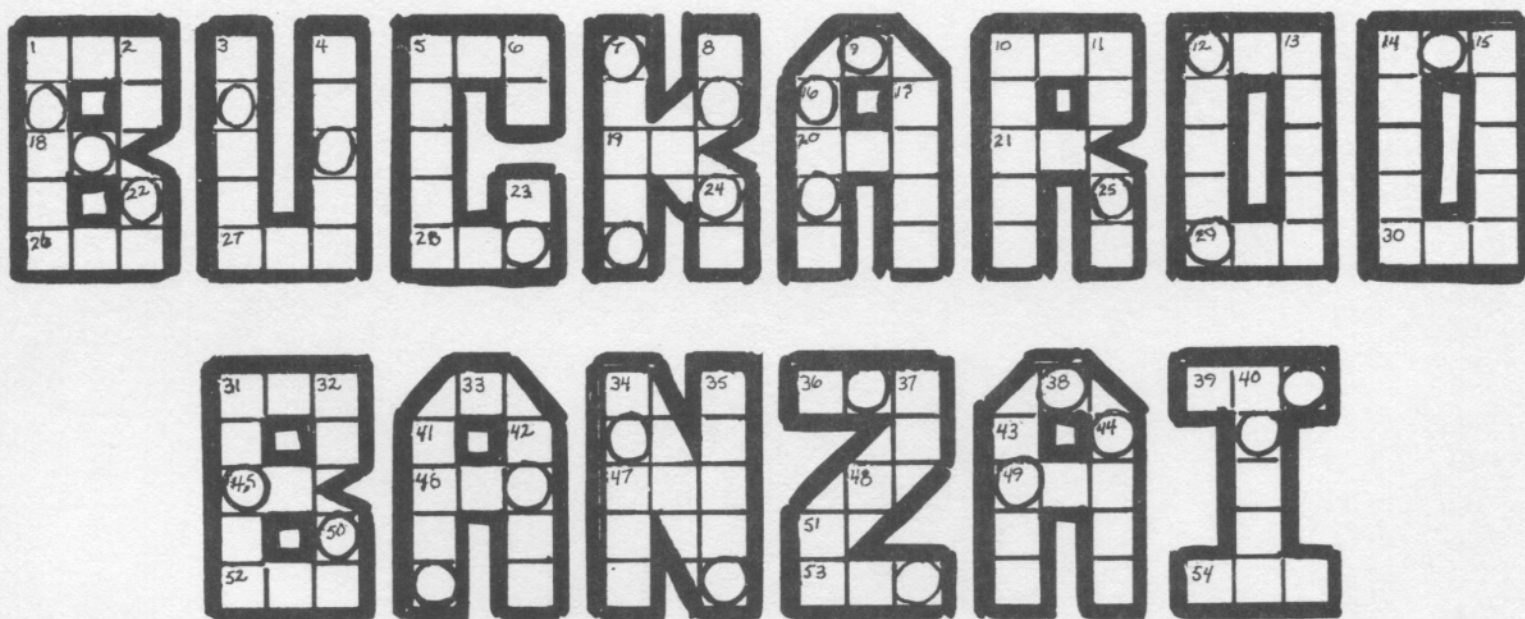
...and a rock is a rock--shoot it in Griffith Park!" So a famous studio head is said to have exclaimed when a director asked to film in a more exotic location. Griffith Park doubles for New Jersey in "TABB," which was shot on locations in the Los Angeles area and on sound stages 23 and 30 at MGM Studios. More location sites include:

- * Yoyodyne Propulsion Systems--the vacant Firestone plant on I-5 between L.A. and Anaheim. If you're heading south (toward Disneyland) the plant is on the left, facing the freeway. A bizarre combination of medieval battlements and Egyptian bas-reliefs, it's very Red Lectroid.
- * The Banzai Institute--a house in the Santa Monica Mountains. It can also be seen in the film "To Live and Die In L.A."

- * Artie's Artery--a recording studio in downtown Los Angeles. Sting's video "Fortress Around Your Heart" was filmed there. According to L.A. BBI David "Monkeyboy" Linck (a West Coast correspondent for MTV), the Artie's Artery logo was still painted on the studio wall in July of 1985, when the video was shot.
- * Team Banzai march--Sepulveda Dam in the San Fernando Valley. The dam area is maintained by the Army Corps of Engineers and is not open to the public. However, travelling northwest on the Ventura Freeway, the dam is clearly visible on the right as you leave the San Diego Freeway/Ventura Freeway interchange at the foot of Sepulveda Pass. Many film fans will recognize the dam from its role as the gates of New York Maximum Security Prison in John Carpenter's film "Escape From New York."

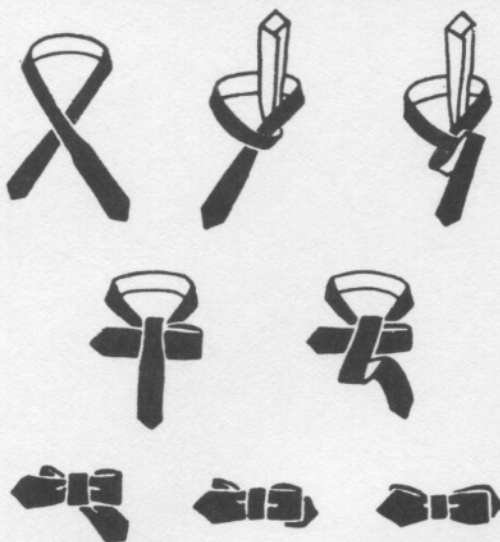

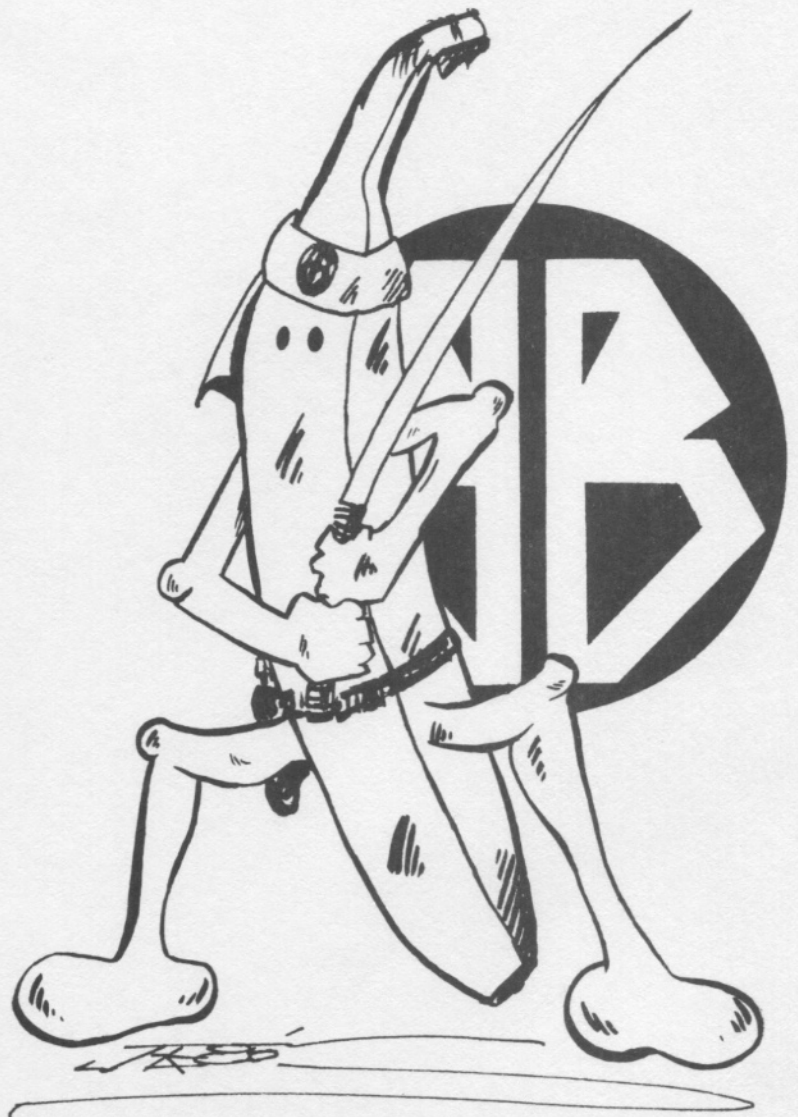
TIE ONE ON WITH BUCKAROO

- 2) Cross long end over short end, passing it through loop.
- 3) Take short end, form front loop of bow.
- 4) While holding front loop with thumb and forefinger, bring long end over loop.
- 5) Do another loop with long end and pull it through the front loop between crossed ends.
- 6) Adjust bow by gently pulling back and forth on loops and ends.
- 7) Keep pulling until bow has desired symmetry.
- 8) Finished tie should not be too perfect or it will look pretied.

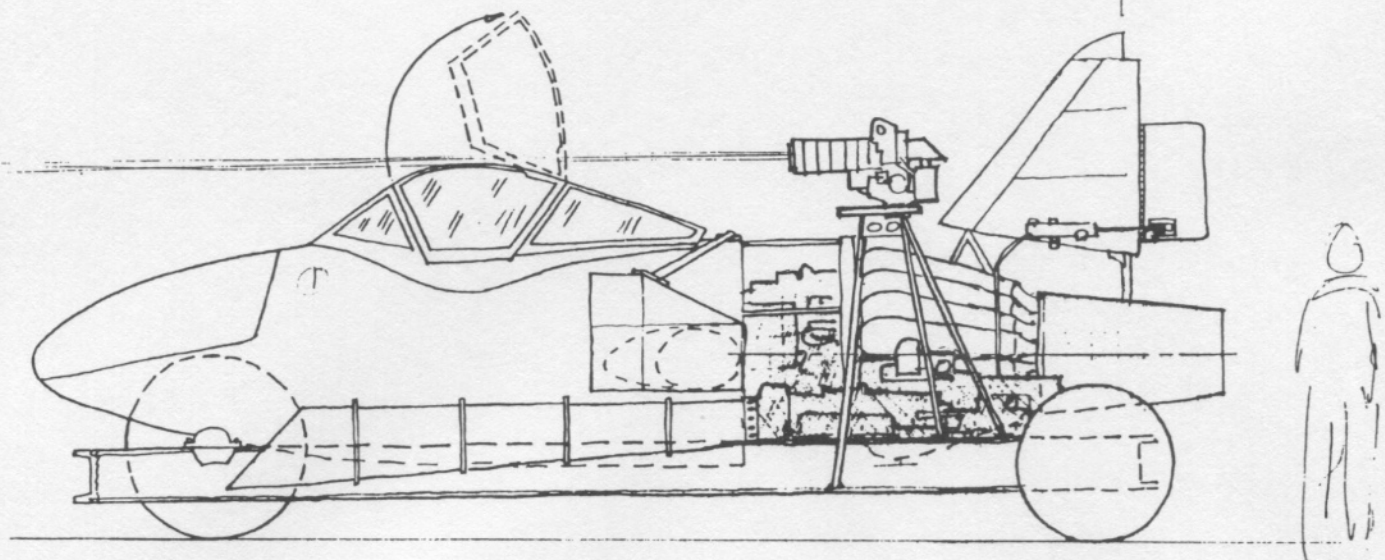
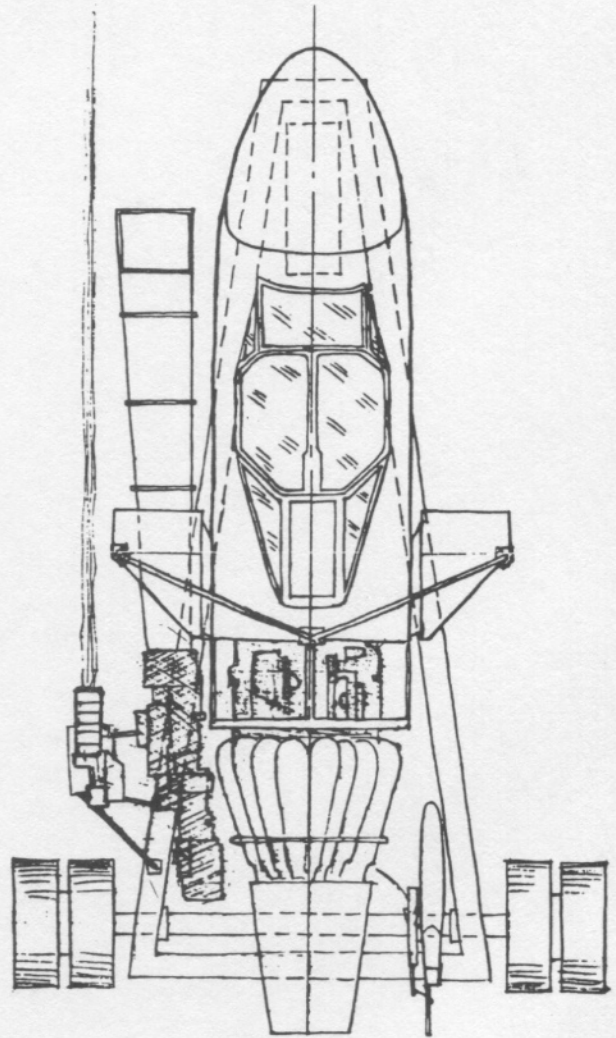

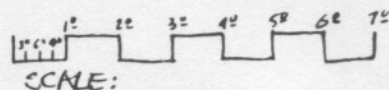

"SINCE I DON'T HAVE YOU"

(Due to many requests for more information about "the love theme from Buckaroo Banzai," Silver Fox has researched the song's history and provided us with this report.)

Joe Rock, a teenager in Pittsburgh, PA wanted to be a studio back-up singer. Attempts at this led to his becoming a local record promoter. A friend told him about a group called The Crescents, made up of a 13-year-old, a 14-year-old and two 15-year-old singers. After adding another 14-year-old named Jimmy Beaumont, they recorded the first song Joe wrote, "Be Mine." With this recording The Crescents became the #1 a capella group in Pittsburgh, after being played on a local radio station request show. The request operators, six girls known as The Saturday Secretaries, started The Crescents' Fan Club, which soon numbered 2000 members.

Joe sent a demo tape to ABC Records and was offered a contract. The group waited too long to sign, so the label withdrew the offer--but not before the group had begun a rumor that they were recording on ABC. Soon several members quit; with replacements, The Crescents were Janet Vogal, Jackie Taylor, Joe Ver Scharen and Wally Lester, with Jimmy Beaumont singing lead and Joe Rock as manager.

Joe's girlfriend broke his heart by moving to an Oklahoma stewardess school. One night, while driving to rehearsal and thinking of her, Joe wrote a song. At each traffic light he jotted down words, then gave the sheet of paper to Jimmy for comments. The next night Jimmy came with a melody and the group started singing the song. Someone had come in with a recorder and the first version of "Since I Don't Have You" was completed. Thinking

the tape had stopped running, Janet ad-libbed the beautiful counterpoint notes of the ending.

Joe Rock sent tapes to thirteen record companies; all thirteen sent back rejection letters. One letter stated that the song was too negative and should be changed to "Since I Have You." Another letter commented, "A song with thirteen 'you's at the end will never sell."

When a new label, Calico, formed in Pittsburgh, Joe set up an audition. On the way, the group had a head-on collision in their 1952 Dodge, but no one was hurt. They signed with Calico after singing "Since I Don't Have You" and "One Night, One Night."

"Since I Don't Have You" was recorded on December 3, 1958, at Capitol Studios in New York City. The record was released the day after Christmas and at 10:20 AM was heard for the first time on Art Pallan's KDKA show. Since the name The Crescents had been used in the falsely rumored ABC signing, Joe chose the new name The Skyliners for the recording group. The record stayed at #1 in Pittsburgh for seven weeks. Dick Clark invited The Skyliners to perform on American Bandstand on Friday the 13th of February, 1959. The very next Monday, they received orders for over 100,000 copies of the song.

"Since I Don't Have You" is registered as written by "Beaumont-Vogal-Ver Scharen-Taylor-Lester;" Joe Rock's name is not included. The song, featured in several movies (including "American Graffiti"), is currently available on recordings by The Skyliners, Art Garfunkel, Gus Hardin, Don McLean (probably the cover truest to the original), Dorothy Moore, Patti LaBelle and Barbra Streisand--and, of course, by Buckaroo Banzai, who never did finish singing it for us.



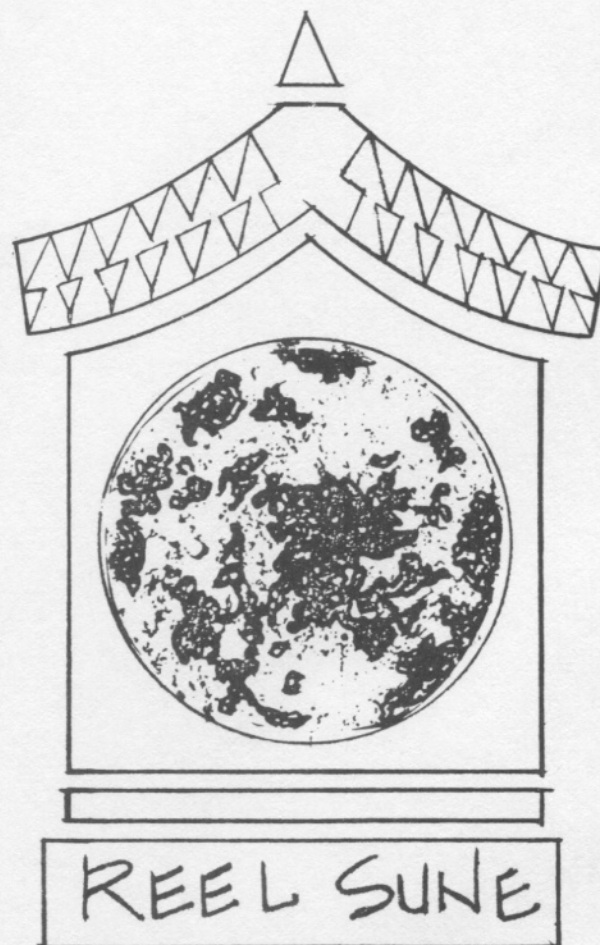
SYNCHRONICITY III--BBIS I
